

# MISSION of the ST. ANN'S SODALITY of ST IGNATIUS PARISH - CONCORD HILL

The St. Ann's Sodality is an organization within the St Ignatius Parish consisting of all ladies of the parish who are 18 years of age or older. The purpose of the organization is to physically, economically – as we are able – and especially -spiritually support St Ignatius Parish and School. This will be accomplished through the efforts of the ladies praying and working together in whatever ways benefit the parish and school.

This includes but is not limited to:

Providing a Mass Intention each year for the living members of the Sodality on July 26<sup>th</sup> -the feast of St. Ann (or as close to that date as is possible).

Providing a Mass Intention each year for all deceased members of the Sodality in the month of November.

Providing a Mass Intention for any member of the Sodality upon the occasion of that member's death.

Sponsoring the "Vocation Prayer Bag" which consists of items for families or individuals to take home for their personal time to pray for vocations. This includes providing items for the bag in conjunction with the parish. The bag includes a crucifix, candle, rosary, and prayer cards for vocation and parish unity.

Presenting or sponsoring any activity which would strengthen the spiritual lives of our members or parish family. The sodality would help financially – as we are able - with costs and/or providing refreshments for these events.

Helping with parish activities which require the making and serving of food/meals for activities (i.e., funerals, school activities, etc.)

Providing funds and/or helping with laundering items for church services.

Providing groups for the bi-monthly and annual cleaning of church -this includes major cleaning of church prior to Easter.

Providing groups for monthly and annual cleaning of rectory – annual cleaning usually occurs when pastor is on vacation.

Committing to prayer for parish, school, and our families by weekly praying of the rosary and the Litany of the Holy Family as a group – usually done after Mass on Thursday morning.

Committing to praying the rosary before Mass on the weekend for pro-life issues, vocations, peace, and our parish family.

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# Dear Padre,

Are we supposed to pray a specific prayer after we genuflect and kneel in the pew before we take our seats? What about after Communion?

There is no particular prayer to say when we genuflect, enter the pew, and kneel for a while. Genuflecting and kneeling are powerful expressions and prayers in themselves—we kneel only to God. But these gestures can become mere routine unless we accompany them with a moment of awareness and recollection and maybe a prayer like, "I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world."



Neither are there required prayers to say in the moments after holy Communion as we return to the pew. But this is a most special time. "Holy souls endeavor to remain as long as possible in prayer after Communion," wrote St. Alphonsus Liguori in The Holy Eucharist. "There is no prayer more agreeable to God, or more profitable to the soul, than that which is made during the thanksgiving after Communion." Eucharist is from the Greek eukharistia, which means "thanksgiving," and this is a time for giving thanks. We remain silently focused on the astonishing passion and affection of our Lord in giving himself to us to eat and make part of ourselves. So much depends on awareness; so much depends on gratitude. Prayer books may help us enter a time of thanksgiving. But we can also say simply, "Jesus, I love you."
